**Criteria for District Awards**  
**RY 2008-2009**

**Eligibility and Documentation**

1. Only Rotary Clubs in good standing with no past dues to RI and the District are eligible to receive awards. This includes payment of the RI or PRM subscriptions based on RI guidelines.
2. Only Rotary Clubs that complied and submitted the Presidential Citation Certification Form by December 31, 2008 are eligible for District Awards.
3. Only Clubs with a working website by December 31, 2008 are eligible for District Awards.
4. All activities should cover the period from July 1, 2008 to March 31, 2009.
5. The Real Good Performance Report (RGPR) must be submitted to the Office of the District Governor by April 5, 2009 together with supporting documents and photos.
6. Attach to your RGP Annual Report copies of your SARs for January 1, 2009 with corresponding RI receipts. Should there be new members inducted between January 2 up to March 31, 2009, the corresponding RI receipts should also be attached.
7. Awarding ceremonies will take place on Saturday, May 30, 2009.

## **ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS**

Significant Achievement Awards are given to Rotary Clubs that significantly contributed to fulfilling the Thrust in the following areas:

1. Rotary Foundation
  - (i) Highest per capita Annual Programs Fund contributions (unrestricted only).
  - (ii) Highest contributions in Annual Programs Fund (unrestricted only) in absolute amounts.
  - (iii) Highest number of contributed Sustaining Members to TRF.
  - (iv) Most innovative strategy for contributions to TRF.
  - (v) For undertaking a significant and successful twinning program (matching grant and/or WCS projects with foreign matched (sister) club).
2. Membership Growth and Development
  - (i) Highest net gain in membership in terms of absolute number (overall only).
  - (ii) Highest net gain in membership in terms of percentage growth (by category, overall).
  - (iii) Highest retention rate (by category, overall).
  - (iv) Most innovative recruitment strategy.
  - (v) Most number of new clubs extended based on Charter Dates approved by RI.
3. Others
  - (i) Registering the most number of Rotarian/ Spouses at the Discon.
  - (ii) Hosting the most number of District Activities.
  - (iii) Sponsoring the most number of Partners in Service (RCC, RC and IC).

- (iii) Strength of relationship between the sponsoring Rotary Club and the Rotaract Club.
- (iv) Rotaract Club must complete at least four activities in any of the four avenues of service provided one of which must fall under community service and one under international service.
- (v) Only Rotaract Clubs that submitted the Rotaract Presidential Citation Certificates Form by March 31, 2009 are eligible for District Awards.

6. Outstanding Interact Club

### Criteria

- (i) How active is the Interact Club?
- (ii) Impact of Interact Club activities on members and school or community.
- (iii) Degree of support given by the sponsoring Rotary Club.

  - Club Service (by category, overall)
  - Community Service (by category, overall)
  - Vocational Service (by category, overall)
  - International Service (by category, overall)
  - Service to Youth (by category, overall)
8. Most Outstanding Club ((by category)
9. Most Outstanding Rookie Club, overall (charted in RY 2008-2009)
10. Most Outstanding Club, overall
